I was in the U.S. Navy at the time, stationed on the U.S.S. Valley Forge CVS-45 out of Norfolk, VA. It was not unusual for me to take a couple guys home to pay for the gas. I often went to Boston on the weekend, which piled the miles on. When my hitch was up the car had over 135,000 miles and was in need of a valve job at the least. So I sold it. Big mistake!!
