



In any event, come late fall, your "pride & joy" —mobiles get tucked away for a long winter's naps. Then we start to yean for old car events. After the fun of summer and the frenzy of Hershey, how does one get an "old car fix"?

Here's where a bus ride comes into play. Also here's where our hard work pays off: we have worked diligently to have an enjoyable trip to the AACA Museum in Hershey, chauffeured professionally and safely, at a reasonable What helps expenses is that the Museum is free to all AACA members who present their I.D. card (it will cost you \$12.00 without your I.D card). 1985 BUICK PARK AVENUE once owned by Gregory and June Roser.

The handsome young couple you see here is your NJ Region President and his lovely wife of 3 years with our very first Buick and our very first brand new car as a married couple, a 1985 Buick Park Avenue purchased in 1984. The color is platinum gray with a red pinstripe, and a boudoir red velour interior, oh so fashionable in the 1980's. The car was purchased at Pace Buick in Summit, NJ, and was a special ordered car. We traded in a 1978 Pontiac Grand Prix SJ that I purchased new before June and I were married in 1981. This was the first of five Buicks owned by us, and we still own two Buicks, a 2005 LeSabre Limited Celebration Edition, and a 2008 Enclave CXL wagon. This was the first year of the drastic GM downsizing of their full sized cars to front wheel drive. This car is unusual in that it had a forward tilting hood, the only one of its kind among GM cars of the era. When this car was a few years old, I was rear ended by a Volkswagen Beetle when stopped at a traffic light, and there was extensive damage. There was also damage to the front end as I was pushed into the car in front of me. Even though it was repaired, it was never quite the same. This Buick was traded in for a 1995 Buick Park Avenue at Lindeman Buick in Westfield, and the 1995 was ultimately handed down to my older daughter when she started to drive. The remainder of our Buicks were purchased at Lindeman, which was forced to close by GM in 2013, after almost 50 years in business. NJ State Legislation of Concern to Owners of Historic Vehicles

The following updates the article "NJ State Legislation of Concern to Owners of Historic Vehicles" reported in the March 2016 Road Map.

The legislation, previously designated as Senate Bill 1108, has been reintroduced in the NJ Senate as S.B. 1423. The text is essentially the same as SB 1108. That is, the motor vehicle commission would be required to issue exempt certificates (windshield stickers) for motor vehicles not required to be inspected. Please see the article in the March Road Map for the issues raised regarding this legislation.


