

Revival Glidden Tour August 30 – September 4, 2015 Oklahoma City, OK

Wow. The last time the AAA Glidden Tour® was in Oklahoma City was June 24, 1910. It's an honor to serve as chairman for the 70th Revival AAA Glidden Tour®. Thank you for your interest. Our committee is working hard to make this an enjoyable event, much the same as Charles Glidden envisioned the tour in 1905.

"The object of the tour and that which prompted the giving of the trophy was to encourage what I believe to be from experience and observation the best health-giving and health-sustaining recreation possible, that of touring with the motor car under conditions suitable for a person to make a tour with members of his entire family. Also to show that greatest achievement that the individual can accomplish with the motor car in line with plain, simple touring and not in racing or fast driving." — Chas J. Glidden

The 70th Revival AAA Glidden Tour is being hosted by the Okie Region of the Antique Automobile Club of America (AACA) Aug. 30 – Sept 4, 2015. The Glidden Tour is the oldest and largest automobile touring event in

America. The first tour was sponsored by the American Automobile Association (AAA) in 1904 to promote the use of the automobile and help create standardized laws for the use of automobiles. The endurance races were held annually until 1913.

In 1946, the Veterans Motor Car Club of America (VMCCA) revived the Glidden Tour® and the tours have been held every year since. The 2015 tour will be a hub (single host hotel) and spoke (travel up to 65 miles out from the host hotel and back) tour. Between 200 and 250 pre-1943 automobiles are expected to participate (450 – 600 people).

I'll be honest, it could be hot. The average high temperature for this time of year is 90 degrees. One of our goals is to have all stops air conditioned. We will also be providing water every morning for your car and yourself. We are evaluating allowing participants to start the tour earlier in the morning if the day's high is expected to be above 85 degrees. This would allow participants to complete the tour prior to the heat of the day.

Please check the website often for updated info and if you register through the website, our committee we will send newsletters periodically with updates about the tour.



My Dad and Craig's Grandfather, Bill Kunz #133, serviced this car for a customer beginning in 1931 and continuously through 1953. At that time the owner asked Bill to purchase the car. The 1929 LaSalle was one of the first cars to feature a synchromesh transmission which made the car a target for hot-rodders. Bill bought the car to save it from the hot-rodders and joined the NJ Region in 1956 leading to many enjoyable years with the car in the club. The car was driven to Hershey every year in the 1960s and used in many of the NJ Region's summer tours through the early 1970s. I inherited the car in 1983 and continued to use it in the club for local meets and parades. Now it is Craig's turn to enjoy the LaSalle and club activities.

1951 MG TD

We are the second owners of this 1951 MGTD. it was a true "barn find". The car is completely unrestored and original, was not running when purchased but with coaxing, lubricating and cleaning has come back to life. The car (whom we have named Malcom) has the original leather-buckled leaf springs, owner manual, Arnolt heater and tool roll. The car features dealer installed canvas top, full tonneau cover, side curtains and a rare accessory bag. Every available in the 50's accessorv was incorporated into this car such as: dual heralding trumpet airhorns, Sparton courtesy chime bell, "ding-dong" bell, Motorola radio, cigarette lighter and ashtray, leather arm rest, fog lamps, manual cruise control, Moto Meter





radiator cap and luggage rack. We have been fortunate to find a Lucas trouble lamp, a vintage Sirram Car Kettle, a 1950 Sirram Picnic Hamper designed for the MG and a Lucas demister. GOOD FELLOWSHIP TROPHY


Donated by Carol and Jack Franz and is to be awarded at the final Tour Banquet to the person, in the estimation of the Tour Master, who has done the most to promote the

I chose to publish the section of our By-Laws dealing with the Region Tour Awards, since our region tourists will just be returning home when this issue is distributed.


