Leif has some great ideas to bring this club into the 21st century, and we need to embrace them if we are to survive. I also have a stack of Spring Meet flyers, hot off the press (thank you Vince), that will go on the upcoming events table in Philadelphia. More important is the editor's NEW DEADLINE of the 12th of the month for submissions to this award winning publication. Sadly, we received late notice of yet another member death in 2015. We remember Ed Neighbour and his family at this difficult time. This makes 13 deceased members for last year, and they are all remembered fondly. We also lost our friend and member Sheldon Halper in January. I had the honor of presenting Sheldon with his AACA 50 year member award at his home last year. We spoke at great length about his many years of

touring with the region, and all the great cars he owned over his lifetime. A 1954 Kaiser Darrin was the last one in his possession, and it was passed down to his son. Sheldon was a region member since 1961, and will be greatly missed. On these notes of losing members, I want to encourage all of you to bring in new members. have received the New Membership Trophy for the last two years for bringing in the most new members, and I would be very pleased to pass the trophy to someone new for this year. Each and every member has the obligation and responsibility to help this club grow. I encourage you to bring in your friends, neighbors, family members, and fellow auto enthusiasts. Whether you like brass era vehicles, fifties and sixties chrome laden machines, or more modern vehicles up to 1991, they are all welcomed here. Owning an antique vehicle is not required. To those older members who dismiss the newer vehicles as too modern, please welcome them and their owners. Disparaging remarks will NOT be tolerated. We strive to make everyone feel welcomed here, and we must do this to survive. AACA has a 25 year rolling rule for a very good reason, and we need to embrace it.

The NJ Region AACA Board of Directors met at my home on January 31st. I offer the following highlights:

- Our auditor and region member PJ Ehmann reported that our books and financial records are all in good order. PJ audits our books each year at no cost to the club.
- 2) The 2016 proposed budget was reviewed and approved by the board unanimously. A copy of the budget is available to any member upon request.
- Some minor housekeeping was done to bring the Constitution and By-Laws up to date. The revised copy will be distributed by e-mail.

- 4) The region membership roster will be finalized and distributed before the February region meeting.
- 5) The Summer Tour will likely be combined with the "Founders Tour." There is a date conflict, and our number of tourists has been declining.
- 6) Our auditor's recommendations were reviewed. It was determined that we will establish a permanent club address with a Post Office Box. Due to the more complicated nature of the Federal and NJ State non-profit tax returns, PJ Ehmann offered to prepare them for the region.
- 7) The board was in general agreement that we will seek new entertainment for the January banquet. Suggestions are welcomed.
- 8) Walnut boards for mounting NJ Region annual awards will be made available to the membership upon request at a reduced price of ten dollars. The region will subsidize the majority of the cost.
- 9) President Greg will solicit additional members to serve on the "Welcoming Committee."
- 10) Several new NJ Region lifetime members will be recognized in the Road Map and at the region meetings.
- 11)A running list of member deaths for the current year will be posted in the Road Map.
- 12) The Spring Meet was discussed and the new location will be stressed in all publications. The vehicle registration fee will remain the same for this year. It was agreed that the year of a new venue is not the time to raise the registration fees. An increase will be considered for 2017. However, the spectator donation will be increased to \$3.00.

We recognize the following NJ Region members who in the last several months have become NJ Region lifetime members; Art Briggs, Duane and Trisha Copley, and Nick and Barbara Matlaga. These members have made a major commitment to the NJ Region.

For those members who may be interested in a lifetime membership, the cost is \$300.00, fifteen times the annual dues. You must first be an AACA national lifetime member.

We have a full calendar for this season, so get these events marked on your calendar. The Spring Meet is coming up in a short two months. Please see the registration, flea market, and trophy sponsor forms in this issue. Do not forget that a second registered vehicle is free for a region member. The second vehicle must be for display only. June and I hope to participate in most of the club events, including more tours. The snowed out trip to see Lucy the elephant in Margate and the world's largest pipe organ in Atlantic City has been re-scheduled for April. Bernie Cooney is planning a bus trip to the AACA Museum in Hershey. Check the club calendar for updates. This is your club, be active and participate. See you on the road, and remember, my line is always open.

- 4) **President Roser** sought a motion to have **PJ** file the region's taxes for 2015. Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously.



NJ State Legislation of Concern to Owners of Historic Vehicles

Senate Bill #1108 requires the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission to issue exempt certificates for motor vehicles that are exempt inspection. The exempt certificate shall be displayed in the same manner as are certificates of approval (inspection stickers), unless the chief administrator shall otherwise prescribe.

The bill was introduced on January 30, **2014** by Senator Michael Doherty. On May 14, **2015** it was passed by the Senate Transportation Committee by a 5-0 vote. On the same date it was referred to the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee where it currently resides.

NJ Region Member stated concerns include: As exempt motor vehicles are not subject to inspection. certificates no approval(windshield stickers) are issued for them to display. It has been stated that on **occasion** operators of these exempt vehicles are stopped by law enforcement because there is no certificate of approval attached to their windshield. It has been further stated that owners of these vehicles must carry all the documentation needed to prove their exempt status. Proposed S.B. 1108 would eliminate this problem. General inspections are not required for historic or collector vehicles. To be classified as a historic vehicle it must be: At least 25 years old, registered (used solely for exhibition and educational purposes by the owner), and display QQ plates. Currently, I am unaware of any members vehicles bearing QQ plates having been stopped as described above.

Collector vehicles, on the other hand, are not registered as historic vehicles, can not be driven more than 3,000 miles per year and must be taken to a State Inspection Station where an inspector will verify the odometer reading.

Why is it necessary to issue exempt window stickers for vehicles already identified as historic vehicles bearing QQ plates?

The proposed legislation does not specify how the exempt stickers will be issued. Will they be mailed to owners of historic vehicles, thereby incurring additional taxpayer expense, or must the vehicle be driven to an Inspection Station?
