


A social visit to the Fireman's Home will give the residents the opportunity to enjoy our cars and a welcome change in their daily activities.

As of mid-April, I've received reservations and deposits from 14 car club members - either AACA NJ Region members or one of several VCCA members who acted on our invitation to join us. That leaves only TEN rooms available. If you are interested in joining us on this weekend, there are two steps: 1) Call Lukans directly at 570-226-4574 to make the room reservation and 2) write out a room deposit check for \$100.00 payable to "NJ Region AACA" and mail it to Pete Cullen, 20 Valley View Road, Verona, NJ 0044, or give it to the Symonds. The Region Treasurer will deposit all checks and write a group deposit to Lukans. This process allows the Region to handle any cancellations, as plans may sometimes change, and, only if we have a substitute for your room, you may receive a refund.

We would love to be able to accommodate every member who wishes to join in the weekend trip. You can even just make it a day trip and join in either day's events — just contact us and let us know which day and tour you might wish to participate.

Details are still subject to change, but right now, here's the plan: On Friday morning, many tourists may gather at a diner along Route 46 in the Belvidere area, and then head out to Bangor, PA to visit the opening Jacktown festival. From there, the group may stop at an area diner, then proceed on a leisurely and scenic ride to the Lake Wallenpaupack area and check in to Lukans before dinner. For Saturday, the group may trek over to Scranton to visit the Houdini Museum and try the Coal Mine tour once again; OR if there is interest, return to Honesdale to board the Stourbridge Line Rail Road again, this time for a 4 ½ hour train excursion to Lackawaxen park for a local BBQ, and then return to Lukans in time for

The combined forces of the NJ Region, AACA and the Raritan River Region, CLC are hard at work; working to bring all club members a unique experience. During the summer when we want to go somewhere, we jump into our cars and go. Sometime we use our "pride & joy"-mobiles. Other times we enjoy the comfort of our modern cars. In any event, come late fall, your "pride & joy"-mobiles get tucked away for a long winter's naps. Then we start to yearn for old car events. After the fun of summer and the frenzy of Hershey, how does one get an "old car fix"?

Here's where a bus ride comes into play. Also here's where our hard work pays off: we have worked diligently to have an enjoyable trip to the AACA Museum in Hershey, chauffeured professionally and safely, at a reasonable price. What helps expenses is that the





Museum is free to all AACA members who present their I.D. card (it will cost you \$12.00 without your I.D card). After we are titillated by all of the wonderful exhibits at the museum, and we have completely sated by an old car fix, our chartered coach will whisk us away to Hoss's Steak House, in Hummelstown. Hoss's, given a private dining room (no food fights, please) we will feast on a truly incredible menu. Our repast will include entrees of beef, chicken and fish; sides of mashed potatoes, baked potatoes, stuffing, ziti, pasta marinara, macaroni & cheese, piroques, rice. We will be able to use the church parking lot for our vehicles. This gives us our best bus rate.

Better luck next time?

In a few days, our long anticipated Spring Meet at the Mennen Sports Arena will take place on May 1st. I have stressed that we will need much more help at this new venue. Being that we have a whole new field layout, 10 to 20 members are needed to help park the vehicles in the proper classes. We have plenty of space, but not enough to allow two spaces for every vehicle. We have more room than at Automatic Switch, which will allow 1-1/2 spaces for each car. That's where the parking crew comes in, to keep everything well organized. For those of you with trailered vehicles, we have ample trailer parking in the rear of the building. Upon entering the Mennen driveway, you will take the first right turn. All show vehicles will take the second right turn into the crescent driveway in front of the building's main entrance. ### From the 2015 NJ Region AACA Constitution & By-Laws

### **ARTICLE XI: ALTERATIONS**

Any proposal to amend this Constitution and By-Laws must be in writing and endorsed by at least ten members in good standing and submitted to the Secretary for recording. The Secretary shall record the proposed amendments and forward to the Board of Directors for approval. The Board of Directors must act within two months of the date of the proposed amendments. If approved by the Board of Directors, such amendment(s) shall be returned to the Secretary who will see that a copy of the amendment(s) is (are) sent to all members in good standing at least ten days prior to the next regular meeting. Passage of shall require proposed amendments approval by three-quarters of the members present at said meeting. If the proposed amendment(s) is (are) not approved by the Board of Directors it may be introduced on the floor at the next regular meeting for appropriate action only after an additional forty signatures have been added to the endorsement. These forty endorsees shall be duly advised of the Board of Director's action before signing and shall be members in good standing. No proposition shall be effective that nullifies the right of any member to the nomination and election of office or the right to vote on the expenditure of Region funds nor which conflicts with the bylaws or regulations of the National A.A.C.A.




