






#### N J Region AACA October Presidents Message



From the 2015 NJ Region AACA Constitution, By-Laws and General Information:

#### **ANNUAL REGION AWARDS**

#### **DIRECTORS' TROPHY**

Donated by William Grier, No. 180, and awarded to the New Jersey Region member showing the nicest un-restored "antique" vehicle (1929 or older) at the Annual Spring Show Meet.

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this award is to encourage New Jersey Region members to preserve exceptionally nice un-restored antique vehicles because they are the best examples of authenticity since the workmanship is original.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- (1) The vehicle must be registered in conformity with the rules of the show committee and must be shown at the Annual Spring Show Meet.
- (2) The recipient of this award MUST be a NEW JERSEY REGION member, and he must be prepared to show proof of ownership. If the vehicle is driven to the meet, it must be in safe driving condition and it must be registered in the owner's name and in a state motor vehicle department in which he has a residence.
- (3) The vehicles in this class will be judged by the New Jersey Region BOARD OF DIRECTORS. If a Board member is absent, a substitute may be chosen by the Board members that are present and the current President or, in his absence, the Vice President. The Board will use currently available judging sheets, and with the system as a guide, they will select the eligible vehicle which, in their opinion, is the

- finest example of an un-restored vehicle at the meet.
- (4) To be eligible, the vehicle must be of the 1929 model year or older. The vehicle must be nearly completely original, and it must present a fine appearance and be a fine example of authenticity. In the interest of proper accounting for originality and authenticity, it is suggested that the Board make extensive use of the minus points (possible multiple of the minus points) for not original and not authentic, as the case may be, for such things as complete repainting and re-striping, reupholstering, re-plating and other such things that may cause a loss of authenticity. Such things as new tires, safety glass, brake lining, battery, ignition points and spark plugs should not count against the car, unless such parts are obviously a wrong choice in respect to authenticity.
- (5) The trophy will be awarded each year that an eligible vehicle is registered and shown as mentioned above. However, the trophy will not be awarded to the same member two years in succession, unless no other eligible vehicle is shown.
- (6) The trophy will remain the property of the New Jersey Region and must be returned upon request and in perfect condition. A permanent award will be given upon return of the trophy.

#### **EXECUTIVES' TROPHY**

Same guidelines as the Directors' Trophy except that vehicles covered must be between 1930 and 1945 and unrestored.

#### MEMBERSHIPS' TROPHY (2)

This award follows the same guidelines as the Directors' Trophy except that vehicles covered must be between 1946 and 1966 for the first trophy and between 1967 to the most recent





year of recognition of an antique car according to AACA guidelines for the second trophy.

The trophy will remain the property of the New Jersey Region and must be returned upon request, and in perfect condition. A permanent award will be given following the return of the trophy, usually at the Annual Awards Banquet.



## AACA John and Janet Ricketts Leadership Scholarship Available

A \$1,500 cash award to any AACA member, child or grandchild of an AACA member in good standing for at least 5 years, who

has been accepted to an institution of higher learning or is now enrolled in such institution. This award is granted by the family of John and Janet Ricketts in recognition of their love for AACA and their belief in service to the club. It is also in recognition of our first female National President, Janet Ricketts in 1999. Region or chapter membership is encouraged but not required.

#### **Eligibility:**

This award is open to any member, child or grandchild of an active AACA member of at least 5 years good standing who:

- 1. is entering any institution or higher learning leading to a diploma.

#### **Technical Tips**

As a kid I never had the money to purchase a timing light. But I learned how to set the timing on my cars without one. I used this trick for years, but it only works on cars with points, so with the advance to electronic ignition I finally had to break down and purchase a timing light.

Turn the engine over to properly align the timing marks on the harmonic balancer to the correct setting (found in any repair manual).

Loosen the distributor bolt so you can turn the distributor and take the distributor cap off.

Determine the direction the rotor turns and turn the distributor so that the points cam rests on a flat part of the distributor cam (so the points are closed).

Turn on the ignition and turn the distributor counter to the rotor direction to the point that the points spark.

Lock the distributor down. Put the cap back on. You just set your timing.

Two of our members achieved AACA National judging milestones this month.




#### **Bob Kapral's 1969 Dodge Charger Nominated for a National Award**

beginning to question whether the salesman had the accurate mileage written down and that instead of the car having 109,000 miles, that it was actually a 9,000 mile car! Again, with all of the previously mentioned original parts, the car still retained its original factory installed sheet metal, weather stripping, glass, etc. Upon doing some digging, we found that the car was sold new from Chrysler to Chrysler. This could very well have been either a regional reps car or someone else high up who worked for Chrysler.

Digging further into the cars history of previous owners, I found a phone number for the third owner who was out in Oregon where the car was sold new. He informed me that when he sold the car, it went to a collector in either North or South Carolina who then sold it to a guy up in Massachusetts, who then gave the car its first external repaint in the factory color. When we got the car, the paint in the door jambs and inside of the trunk was still the factory applied paint along with its original factory applied tire pressure decal, federal mandate sticker, and the trunk jacking instruction decal. From Massachusetts it then went to a new owner in New Hampshire, who decided to part with it and put it on consignment with the broker we got the car from.

It took me about a year and a half to complete the restoration for Dad and I completed it the week before Christmas. Seeing how close it was to Christmas, I felt it was appropriate to buy a huge bow and put it on the car and take a picture for Dad since this was part of his Christmas present. I put a bunch of money and time into the car myself (being that Dad is on a limited budget since he is retired) which he did not know about. My Mom and I had been purchasing parts and other stuff for the car and giving it to him for various celebrations

such as Valentines Day, birthday, etc. all of which made this car what it is now, a pristine example of what the car would have looked like as if it had just rolled off the assembly line.

Back to all the money and time that was tied up into the car..... remember how I said Dad had wanted a nice convertible touring car that had a nice big trunk? Well, after we got it and found out how original the car was, I convinced Dad to do a full blown restoration on the car. Partly because the car retained so many original parts and features, but the other part was we found out that there were only 700 of these cars produced! Our car is 1 of 362 that came with the 440 cubic inch, V-8 engine backed to the automatic Chrysler 727 transmission. Of those 700 cars produced, there are only 47 left known to exist as of 2002. Once I found out how many of these cars were left known to exist and that the last count was so old, I decided to start my own 1969 GTX Convertible registry. I am currently at a count of 40 cars that are still surviving in various conditions.

This past year we have won all kinds of numerous awards with it starting with achieving our AACA First Junior down in Virginia Beach, VA and recently achieving our Senior National award out in Hershey. We are planning on taking the GTX out to Williamsport next year to try for our AACA First Junior Grand National award. Hopefully, we will do as good as we did out in Hershey!




