
### November 3, 2016

From the 2015 NJ Region AACA Constitution & By-Laws

#### **ARTICLE III: ELECTED OFFICERS**

Section 1. The President shall appoint a nominating committee at the September meeting, which shall consist of not less than three persons who shall meet and select one or more candidates for each office.

Section 2. The Nominating

Committee shall make their report at the October meeting.





This report may be amended by a motion or motions from the floor.

Section 3. The nominating committee's report and a Ballot shall be part of the November meeting (Election Meeting) notice sent to all members in good standing. This includes Joint Members, each of whom shall be sent a ballot.

Section 4. Each member shall mark their ballot, seal it in an envelope marked "BALLOT" and return it to the Secretary at or in time for the Election Meeting.

Section 5. No ballots shall be issued to members not in good standing nor returned to the Secretary in any manner excepting as indicated in Sections 3 and 4.

Section 6. The Region President shall appoint three tellers at the Election Meeting to count the ballots and report the vote to the members. A majority of votes cast for each office will be required for a choice in each office.

Section 7. Vacancies for any cause shall be filled by a vote of the members present at the next regular meeting of the Region, said officer or officers to serve the un-expired term, excepting if the Presidency shall become vacant, the Vice President shall assume office for the un-expired term.

#### <u>Free – Blue Region Name Badges – Free</u>

I can order the blue Region Name Badges for any club member and family members who need them. They are required when attending Region Business Meetings. Failure to show them results in a 50 cent fine. They are free and will come with each new membership. New members will need to supply me with the following information: Name, Region Number, home address. If you are not a new member, the year you joined the club.






