





Shayna Geller suffered when their home in Blairstown and all its contents were destroyed in a fire on September 6th. Also destroyed in the fire were two of their cars, and one of their two cats perished. Thankfully Ed and Shayna escaped the burning home uninjured. The fire started in one of their modern cars in the attached garage. My most sincere thanks go to the following NJ Region members who assisted me with the salvage mission at the Geller's home on September 10th; Treasurer Tim Schimmel, who borrowed a friend's utility trailer, 2009 Region President Bob Kapral, who brought his pick-up truck, and Greg Newell and Membership Secretary Bill Pritchett who supplied additional labor. We were all very dirty and tired, but it was a labor of love. Everyone responded on very short notice, and for that I am grateful. We were able to salvage some cherished family items and some items from the basement. Everything however was wet and/or smoke damaged, and some salvaged items were scorched. One of their neighbors generously offered their barn for storage of these items. Most everything else was lost in the fire. Their antique cars were stored in a detached garage and were undamaged, even though the outside of the garage suffered extensive damage. The keys for these vehicles were however lost in the house fire. Our member Dave Cavagnaro lent Ed and Shayna his Chevrolet Tahoe, as they had no form of transportation. Ed and Shayna were staying temporarily with neighbors after the fire. The Gellers also lost their computers and their paper records of the club's participation points. I have however come up with a solution as I

will complete the point year tally for Shayna. This is detailed in a separate article in this issue, and I request the members' full cooperation. Daisy Wary has graciously offered take over Shayna's region meeting refreshment responsibilities until Shavna is able to return. Ed and Shayna have for many years behind the scenes set up the tables and chairs for our region meetings at the VFW hall. The Truck I bought for Trish

About 10 years ago I was chasing dodge truck parts on e-bay and ran across an ad advertising a 1989 Dodge Dakota convertible for sale. I thought about it after studying the photo and sort of remembered when they came out for sale. By 1989 we were up to our backsides in little girls and new trucks were not high on my list of things to concern myself. I touched base with my "in house" financial adviser and mentioned that if I ever run across one locally I'd be interested in bringing it home.

Six month later I was visiting a friend in Belvidere and there was a one page local newsletter on the kitchen table. Among the list of items for sale was a 1990 Dodge Dakota convertible. I copied down the number and called it when I got home. The elderly lady who answered said it belonged to her son and she would have him call when he got home from work. Later that evening I got the call and knew immediately who I was talking with and so did he. We discussed condition and price and I asked when we could take a look at it. He said the next day would work for him so I asked if it was at his home and he said no. That was when I learned he had it stored in a barn less than 2 miles from my home.

Needless to say, I brought it home and over a period of time cleaned it up, gave it some paint and new decals and drove the wheels off it. They produced less than 900 of these trucks in 1990 of which less than half are 4X4. It is powered by a 3.9L V6 with a 3 speed automatic and overdrive. Guess I need to

start taking it out again!!!!.....yes I did give it to Trish.....well sort of.

# From the 2015 NJ Region AACA Constitution & By-Laws

ARTICLE II: OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS


