

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



s we begin, yet another eventful year, I'm reminded of several email exchanges these past two years. The emails came from from prospective event chairs, who requested a specific date, for an event, only to find that that date was already committed. Having co-

ordinated our annual calendar, I sensed the frustration of those members, but was gratified by their persistence and conscientiousness, in wanting to make something happen. This year, I'm very pleased to tell you that our activity calendar is *three*, full pages long! Additionally, we did many new things last year and this year promises to bring, yet, more of the same.

I'm very optimistic about our club, especially because of its increasing membership engagement. More members than before are stepping up to identify new venues that our members can enjoy. Others are finding more ways that a familiar event can become that much more interesting and motivating even more of our club members to participate. For a moment, let me tell you about the results of our members' achievements.

This year, <u>eleven</u> event venues have agreed to give our club a donation. This happened, because just a few of our members recognized the inherent value that our club can provide. They expended diligent efforts to justify our participation, particularly in senior living communities, that easily warranted a donation. For the first time, our club helped cosponsor a car show along with a community organization, from which a generous percentage of the event's revenue was donated.

This year, we've commitments for *twenty one*, \$50. O Spring Meet sponsorships. Last year, we had sixteen. At no time in my memory have we ever had as many sponsors. Why the difference? Member engagement. More club members are stepping up, by committing their dollars, or asking others to do the same. Last year, our membership roster increased from 177 members to 207. That was an increase of 30 members, or seventeen percent. There are few, if any, regions in America, where their membership has increased to such a large degree.

We'll be redoubling our recruiting efforts this year as well. As an example, our club will be assigned a designated section for its members at the Flemington Speedway antique auto show in Octo-

ber, which routinely draws over 1,000 cars. We've an impressive membership booth and an equally impressive, tri-fold brochure, for the first time that lend further credibility to our club. Together, they best reflect what NJAACA is all about. We believe that we'll be able to attract many new members from just that one event.

The point that I'm making is, if you're not already personally involved in our growth, then you should ask yourself, "Why not"? You could volunteer to man our recruiting booth for an hour or two. You can chair a new event, or coordinate a tour. How about recruiting a new member? Why not volunteer to chair a committee, should a vacancy occur? Or, you can contribute a new idea, on any topic, which has the potential to help make the club that much more effective, productive and enjoyable.

It's not important what you do. It's more important that you're personally contributing a small part of yourself, for the benefit of the whole. You'll find great satisfaction in realizing that you'll be playing an active part in our club's health, member satisfaction and future growth.

A few growing pains were felt during the first two years, with traffic flow 'guidance' from the assigned County Police, and spectator parking, both for real improvements in accessing the show field. Real inhouse food vendor and bathrooms at the arena are also a big step up from prior location.

The Region Board of Directors and the Spring Meet planning committee have been busy with preparations for the Spring Meet. The registration form and show flyers have already been printed and distributed at the Philadelphia Annual Meeting to national AACA members. It is also printed in this April Road Map and is posted on the Region's website for your use. In early March, it was mailed to over 400 nonmember past participants in our prestigious judged car show, and upon suggestions made at the March meeting, that mailing also included the new Region Membership brochure!

The Region has held the line for the car registration fees for yet another year! May I point out that if you preregister before the April deadline, you will not see another quality car show anywhere for less than the Region's \$10 fee! And do not forget to self-nominate if eligible for any of the special Region Trophies listed in the box on the lower left of the registration flyer. Last year we had several trophies not awarded due to lack of your own nominations!

I would like to remind you of another unique memberonly benefit we've retained: If you pre-register one car, in addition to snagging the above mentioned discounted fee, you can 'show-a-second-car-forfree' ("Do Not Judge" category). So, get a family member involved and let's see 'the other car' in your garage, even if it may not be ready for prime time! And look for the article elsewhere in the Road Map promoting the award sponsorship opportunities available.

To help any members interested in judging (we need at least 40!), Ed Geller, Chief Judge, will once again be conducting a seminar for the benefit of both first time and experienced judges, on Sunday April 29<sup>th</sup> at Ashley's Body Shop, see Region Calendar for details.

A reminder everyone that volunteers are needed for everything from the registration table, to parking, to judging, and manning the Regions' membership tables. A sign-up sheet will be circulated at the April and May meetings so the planning committee can make appropriate staffing arrangements. In the meantime, you now have four and a half weeks to get your cars ready for the Region's big show!

Pattie Bleu was purchased new by my parents Jack and Lucille Quattrocchi in 1977 at Lex Depp Cadillac in Florham Park, NJ, which later became Royal Cadillac. My Mom used the car daily

for real estate sales. She was a "Million dollar sales woman" for the Richard C. Fischer Agency in Basking Ridge, NJ from 1965 until her retirement in 1980. Jack and Lucille continued to use the car almost dai-Iv until their deaths in 1999. Pattie Bleu went into storage soon thereafter until she awoke from her slumber in early 2005, when she was used as the bridal car at the wedding of my parent's oldest granddaughter. I received the Cadillac in the fall of 2006 when the estate of my parents was settled. I named the car in honor of my wife Pattie, at the time we were married 25 years. The 1977 Cadillacs were drastically changed from the year before. This year all GM full sized cars were downsized to attain better fuel economy. The deVilles lost approximately 10 inches in length and about 700 pounds compared to the 1976 models, yet gained more interior room and a larger trunk. Other big changes for 1977 were; 4door hardtops were no longer available, the engine size was reduced from 500 to 425 cubic inches, and the deVilles had no rear fender skirts for the first time since 1958. The Cadillac color is "Jennifer Blue", which explains the car's name of Pattie Bleu. The original base price was \$9,864, which included standard luxury features such as climate control air conditioning, power windows, 6-way power seat, power door locks, and white wall tires. The final sticker price was \$10,968 less shipping charge. This included the extra cost options of a vinyl roof, leather interior, tilt & telescoping steering wheel, carpeted floor mats, trunk mat, rear window defroster, and AM/ FM stereo radio with a power antenna. Pattie Bleu is used on a weekly basis, weather permitting, and now has well over 100,000 miles on the odometer. She has participated in holiday parades in both Plainfield and Cranford, as well as many NJ Region AACA events. Pattie Bleu received her Historic Preservation of Original Features (HPOF) certification at Hershey in October of 2017, and I hope to go for my "HPOF Original" award this year. My friend Greq Roser was kind enough to drive it to Hershey for me, as my wife prefers that I not drive long distances. I appreciate Greg offering his front cover photo opportunity to me, and I am proud to be a member of AACA and the NJ Region.



### 2017 National Awards Summary By Bob Parish

Vice President, National Awards



he February 10th Awards Banquet in Philadelphia, in conjunction with the AACA Annual meeting, culminated the 2017 National Awards process. The 2017 calendar year produced 2,788 vehicles that were shown at National meets and 349 vehicles that participated on National tours that

were evaluated by the National Awards team.

The National Awards Committee consists of 26 of the most experienced AACA Senior Master judges, with a combined total in excess of 6300 judging credits. The committee meets each year in Hershey on the first Saturday in December to review all the nominated vehicles for the year. The team votes to determine the National Award winners for each of the 64 potential vehicle categories. This year some 278 owners were nominated for one or more of the prestigious National awards available to all members. We invite everyone to visit the AACA website to become more familiar with the various awards in our world class judging system. Go to www.aaca.org/ publications/national-awards to see a listing of all the awards. These awards reflect quite a heritage including how they were initiated and sponsored, with some going back to 1945. The actual awards are on permanent display at our National headquarters in Hershev. PA.

There will be an additional award available beginning in 2018, the Discontinued Automobile Award. This award will be divided into early and late models to relieve the pressure on the original award concept. The split will be early (up to 1959) and late (1960 to present). Historically, our data base research indicated that would be the mid-point for such a split.

The National Awards competition is extremely intense, making decisions very difficult. At the February 10th Annual Meeting there were 72 award winning owners and their vehicles that were recognized

for their accomplishments during the National Awards Banquet in Philadelphia. National Service Awards to organizations and individuals were also presented for their contributions to the success of our hobby, and AACA as a whole. There were 21 Master Editor Awards and 21 Master Webmaster Awards presented to members for their contributions to their respective Regions and Chapters.!




