





1935 or 36 Maytag Winston "Toy Racer" Owned and Driven by Bob Smith (#420)

aytag Toy Racers were made as a sales promotion by the Maytag Company from October 11, 1934, until December 1, 1941. In that time they made 498 such racers. They coexisted with Winston Racers and Grimes Toy Trucks. As well as being used by dealers to encourage children to distribute advertising material or to arrange for demonstrations of washing machines in homes, they were given away in local contests based on sales, and in some cases sold outright as gifts to children.

In the late 30's this racer was found in the basement of a large mansion being torn down in Morristown. The racer was given to the father of Bob Smith's eventual brother in law as a trade for some truck repair work that need to be paid off.

Bob smith received the racer in 1942 while his brother-in-law was in the Pacific fighting the war. Despite the gas rationing of the time during WWII, Bob drove the racer regularly, to this day he refuses to

divulge how he kept a steady supply of fuel for the racer. Bob's father had an "A" ration Sticker which would allow for 3 to 4 gallons a week but still could not understand why his car used so much gas. Bob drove the racer all over town and beyond, and for several years would carry an extra quart of fuel at his feet to supplement the quart tank the engine ran on.



Recalling the end of Bob's travels he is re-

minded how on one particular trip home he decided to shoot around a coal truck that was off loading. He nearly caused an accident since the truck was blocking most of the road. A concerned citizen made a call to Bob's father and that was the end of Bob's adventures in the racer. He was getting to big for it anyway.


In the 50's Bob painted the racer with a brush and lent it to his nephew for enjoyment. A few years later while sitting in a garage the racer sustained damage. Bob retrieved it and took the racer back under his are for future restoration. Body damage and a lack of tires kept the racer in Bob's basement

until 2017 when he came across a source of new tires. Buoyed by that discovery, the energy arrived for a full restoration. Since his recovery of the racer Bob has acquired two extra engines, but he still can't get back in the cockpit.

A total of 498 Maytag Toy Racers are known to have been made, of which only about 35 are still in existence--many of them in museums. The first models were powered by the single-cylinder Model 92 Maytag Multi-Motor with a cone clutch. Racers produced after serial number 934 were powered by the Maytag Twin-Cylinder engine; this unit used a belt-tightening arrangement for a clutch. The brake and clutch were operated with one lever on both models. The top speed was approximately 8 and 9 mph

Today Bob's Racer is a nice "looker" and conversational toy, but most of all it's a great piece of history that Bob continues to share with all those who care to look.














Road Trip to Historic Vehicle Museums in PA Saturday, August 25, 2018

ttention antique automobile enthusiasts, I have arranged for "A Road Trip to Historic Vehicle Museums in PA" which will include the Boyertown Museum of Historic Vehicles and the Old Spokes Car Museum facility in New Smithville. Both facilities can easily and safely handle around 100 visitors at a time. Both museums will charge us an entry fee of \$6.00 per person, which is their Senior/Group Rate. Please bring exact change for your party to make it easier and quicker for us to enter each facility. Since we are members of an antique car club, please drive an antique vehicle that can safely negotiate a round trip of approximately 200 miles, depending on your starting point.



Our route will be planned to avoid or limit travel on any super highways (i.e. Rte. I-78).

We will depart from the parking lot at the Readington Dinner, where we have assembled previously, at between 8:30 and 9:00 am, so please be on time. Join the Fun Become an AACA Judge

here are two certainties at every AACA national meet:

- 1) We can't hold an AACA national meet (or regional meet) without antique vehicles; and
- 2) We can't hold AACA meets without judges.

I want to thank every AACA member who already serves as an AACA judge or is in the AACA Judges Honor Society. Your efforts as judges allow our club to fairly evaluate all the vehicles present on our show fields and to recognize and appropriately reward the owner's efforts to preserve, restore, and maintain his/her antique vehicle.

To those AACA members who aren't judges, I strongly encourage you to give it a try. Serving as a judge not only ensures we have enough judges at every meet to keep the workload for each judging team at a reasonable level, it also helps you better assess your own vehicle before entering it into an AACA meet. You can read the AACA Official Judging Guidelines and get a good understanding of the club's judging criteria, but the best way to understand them more completely is to attend an AACA Judging School and then serve on an Apprentice Judging Team. Even if you decide you don't enjoy judging—but I think you will—you'll have a better understanding of what those judges are doing when they circle your car for five to ten minutes and gain an appreciation of the attention, fairness, and reasonability they're applying when they judge a vehicle.

Becoming an AACA judge is easy: register online to judge on the AACA website or by mail before the deadline for a national meet, attend an AACA National Judging School (offered at every AACA national meet, typically on Friday afternoon before the show on Saturday), attend the Judges Breakfast on Saturday morning at the meet and find out the team you've been assigned to, then go out and have some fun judging. The first time you judge at an AACA meet, you will be assigned to the Apprentice Judging Team, which ensures your first experience judging will be stress-free. Depending on the number of judges and cars on the

show field, judging usually takes less than two hours.

After serving as an Apprentice Judge the first time you judge, at future meets you'll be assigned to a judging team based on the competition judged ("points judging") or certification class preferences you submit when you register to judge. Your judging team will consist of a team captain and four judges. The team captain will be an experienced Senior Master Judge and usually very familiar

with the vehicles in the classes you're judging. Your fellow judges will have varying levels of judging credits—some more than you, some less than you (after you've judged a few times)—but all bring different experience and knowledge. If your experience is similar to mine, you'll meet some interesting and nice people and learn something new from them each time you judge.

So, if you're an AACA judge—thank you very much for sharing your knowledge, experience, and time with us! If you're not a judge yet—why not? Join the fun—share your knowledge with us and learn something new in the process. (And you can impress people when you tell them you're an AACA judge!) I look forward to serving with you on the show field at a future AACA meet



1951 Crown Imperial 8 Passenger Sedan Paul Wolfmeyer No. 41 In 2017 Participation Points

.I have been interested in Chrysler "long bodies" from the time I first saw them at my second -cousin's funeral home in Kansas (when I was about eight). This Crown Imperial was Chrysler's most expensive and heaviest car in 1951. It was owned by a doctor in Columbus Ohio for 26 years; I presume it was the family car. I acquired it in 1994 in Indiana; it was restored in 1998. 1951 was the first year for the hemi engine, power steering, and electric windows. In an unusual move for the 1950s, the 1951 Imperial had noticeably less chrome than the lower-priced New Yorker that it was based on. It also had three horizontal grille bars with the parking lights between the bars and a chrome vertical center piece. Aside from its front fender nameplate, side body trim was limited to the moldings below the windows, rocker panel moldings, bright metal stone shields and a heavy horizontal molding strip running across the fender strips. 1951 was also the year that Chrysler introduced its 331 cu in (5.4 L) Hemi head V8. "Hydraguide" power steering, an industry first for use in production automobiles, became available on the Imperial for an additional \$226. Full-time power steering was standard on the Crown Imperial.




