1931 Ford Model A Victoria Denise & Wayne Tuck No. 6 In 2017 Participation Points

We purchased this car in 2013 in order to have a car older than 1932 to qualify for the AACA Vintage Tour.

Affectionately referred to by most Victoria owners as a "Vicky", this was considered to be one of the more upscale versions of the Model A Fords.

Prices for the Model A ranged from US\$385 for a roadster to US\$1400 for the top-of-the-line Town Car. The engine was a water-cooled L-head inline four with a displacement of 201 cu in. with 40 hp. Top speed was around 65 mph. The Model A had a 103.5 in wheelbase with a final drive ratio of 3.77:1. The transmission was a conventional unsynchronized three-speed sliding gear manual with a single speed reverse. The Model A had four-wheel mechanical drum brakes.

On the Vintage tours we have attended it is normally driven an average of 100 miles a day for five days. This car has been extremely reliable and truly a joy to drive. As a good friend told me, "Everyone should own at least one Ford Model A in their lifetime". I Agree!



or the eighth year, the Region will once again explore the Pennsylvania Pocono area for its Fall Foliage Tour. The lodging destination is Lukans Farm Resort! But, due to Hershey weekend being a week later in October this year, this tour will take place the third weekend BEFORE Hershey.

We've reserved 22 available rooms for Region members, but the hold is valid only until August 4th. Expanding on the process started a few years ago, we've been asked to handle the reservations with membership internally. Due to the possibility of last minute changes in tourist's plans, Lukans has asked that the Club handle the deposit monies and keep track of the reservations until the group is finalized. So, there is no need to call Lukans to reserve your room, nor to send them a deposit directly. Your tour masters will handle the room requests.

This is how reservations will be done this year: Step #1 - Email Pete Cullen at oldcarz57@aol.com to add your name to the list; Step #2 - Write a check for \$100, payable to "NJ Region AACA" and hand it to Pete at a meeting or Region event, or mail it USPS to Pete Cullen, 20 Valley View Road, Verona NJ, 07044; Step #3 - Get your car ready and packed!

HOW MUCH:

A) All 4 days with 3 nights rooms, 7 meals is approximately \$600 plus tax & tips/Couple, Double Occupancy, includes spacious room (can sleep two couples), and 7 meals while there. (Deluxe rooms are \$300/night pp, Poolside are \$290/night pp, including meal plan with 3 dinners, 3 breakfasts and 1 lunch).

B) Usual 3 days with 2 nights rooms, 5 meals, approximately \$450 per couple.

WHAT NOW: Recognizing that fall is a peak time, they will hold the rooms until SATURDAY, AUGUST 4th for any Region member. If interested you must follow the above reservation instructions. A deposit of \$50 per person, or \$100/couple/room will be required, check payable to "NJ Region AACA" but given to Pete Cullen to deliver.

Also note that there are only 22 rooms at Lukan's, and as for the last several years, it is first come, first served. If you are late and are told all rooms are taken, I can add your name to the waiting list, as a few members have had to make last minute cancellations in the past.

Alternately, as Lukan's dining room is open to the public for meals, and if you plan to be in the area during any part of the tour, you are welcome to join in the fun for just a day trip or even for a one night stay, provided vacancy is available.

We have some great plans for the group on the way up to, and during our stay at Lukans. More details about the tour stops will be provided in a future article. We look forward to another interesting, if not relaxing, weekend! Go ahead and make your reservations NOW!

Donald J. Ball



86, of Oceanport, passed away peacefully at home on Tuesday, November 28, 2017. Proud of his military service, Donald served 3 years in the US Army, from 1951-1954, during the Korean War. He served as Private First Class and received 3 service medals before being honorably discharged. After his military service, Donald worked for many years as a supervisor with the State of New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of Consumer Affairs, Office of Weights and Measures, retiring in 1992. Donald was an avid collector of antiques, including clocks, radios, watches and cars. A beautiful 1965 Ford Thunderbird has arrived and is on loan from Susan Sganga of New Jersey (NJAACA #1547). The 1965 Thunderbird, 2 door hardtop Landau was built at the Wixom, MI assembly plant on June 16, 1965. The vehicle was then delivered to Country Side Motors located in Springfield, PA where it was sold for \$4,958.90. Since then the Thunderbird has been restored to its original exterior color, Diamond Blue (Code N) with its original Blue Vinyl Landau Top.





The body of the 1965 Thunderbird body, glass and trim, and chrome are in fantastic condition for the age of the car. Its original interior is finished in trim code 52 Turquoise Blue. It also has a unique Swing Away Steering Wheel. It's powered by the original 390 CID with over 300 HP mated to a 3 Speed Dual Range Automatic Transmission and a 3:00:1 Rear Axle Gear Radio. The vehicle has Power Steering, Power Brakes, and Power Windows.

A total of 20,974 Landaus #63B were produced in 1965. According to the Thunderbird Registry, this is one of only 1,126 registered Thunderbird Landaus remaining and documented in the world.

This 1965 Thunderbird is replacing the 1963 Principality of Monaco Thunderbird in the rotating exhibit. Make sure to stop by and see the 1960 Thunderbird and the 1957 Battlebird Thunderbird too.

ttention antique automobile enthusiasts, I have arranged for "A Road Trip to Historic Vehicle Museums in PA" which will include the Boyertown Museum of Historic Vehicles and the Old Spokes Car Museum facility in New Smithville. Judging Results

How do I get a copy of my judging sheet?". A simple letter to the Vice-President of Judging can get you the information you desire.

The letter is to be mailed to the current Vice-President of Judging at the address provided in the Antique Automobile magazine or the club website and

should include the following:

- 1. Your name and address
- 2. The year, make and model of your show vehicle
- 3. The judging class for your vehicle
- 4. The meet you attended
- 5. A self-addressed stamped envelope for the return of your results

It is the policy of the AACA to provide a summary of the deductions received and not an exact score. As a result, you will receive a highlighted judging sheet disclosing the areas in which deductions were made.

You can use this information to inspect your vehicle and possibly improve it for the next meet or next level of competition. It is often helpful to have another judge or a member of your Region review the vehicle with you.

The AACA standard for judging is to present your car as it was delivered to the original owner from the dealer. Items that are not period correct receive deductions, as well as items that no longer appear new.

While the AACA promotes competition, remember that this is a hobby. Have fun at the meets and enjoy your historic vehicle.

ince I do not have an antique of my own, I decided to ask my dad about the Nova he had when I was growing up; the car that I despised with a passion and would not be caught dead in during my middle and high school years! He bought it brand new in August of 1977 for \$3,800 in cash. It was a 6-cylinder, 3-speed on the floor.

The picture you see is the only picture he has of the car, after an accident in 1985. That accident took the car off the road for a year until he got a different front clip on it, and in 1987 he put a 5-speed in it that was from a Pontiac Sunbird. The car ran until 1997 when he scrapped it, with 350,000 miles on it.

What I remember most is how he let me sit up front when I was little, and he was showing me how to shift, and letting me do it when he told me. I also fondly remember being buckled in the backseat with my younger sister and there were holes in the floorboards. My sister and I found joy in dropping stuff through the holes and watching it fly out. When we were yelled at for doing that or for fighting, I often just looked through the hole at the road as we were speeding over it.

I was embarrassed by this car after the accident. One front fender was black, the hood was primer, the rest was red. It was just not as beautiful as it once was, and my young teenage ego was at stake, so I often ducked and tried having my dad drop me off down the street and I would walk to school the rest of the way. He often didn't listen and took joy in embarrassing me by drawing even more attention to me and the car ha-ha. Looking back, I do miss that car and when I see one, I take a picture and send it to my dad because it brings back so many memories as it was a major part of my childhood.
