The Triumph Spitfire is a small British two-seat sports car, introduced at the London Motor Show in 1962. In 1973 in the United States and Canada, and 1975 in the rest of the world, the 1500 engine was used to make the Spitfire 1500. Further improvements to the suspension followed with the 1500 included longer swing axles and a lowered spring mounting point for more negative camber and a wider rear track. The wider, lower stance gave an impressive skid pad result of 0.87g average. This put the Spitfire far ahead of its competition in handling. Detail improvements continued to be made throughout the life of the Mark IV, and included reclining seats with "chequered brushed nylon centre panels" and head restraints.

The last Spitfire, an Inca yellow 1980 built for the UK-market model with hardtop and overdrive, rolled off the assembly line in August 1980, shortly before the factory closed. It was never sold and is now displayed at the British Motor Heritage museum at Gaydon. There were 95,829 Spitfire 1500s built between 1974 and 1980

My 1976 Triumph Spitfire was purchased from the original owner with only 37,000 miles. It has a 1500 cc 4-cylinder engine and 4 speed manual transmission. The car was well maintained and only driven when the weather was nice with the top down.

As everyone was voraciously hungry, we did not bother ending the meeting, rather just took a generous break for food.


Much, much later, when all appetites were sated, **President Peck** once again assumed his elevated position to announce birthdays and to introduce **Bob Smith.**

or the eighth year, the Region will once again explore the Pennsylvania Pocono area for its Fall Foliage Tour. The lodging destination is Lukans Farm Resort! But, due to Hershey weekend being a week later in October this year, this tour will take place the third weekend BEFORE Hershey.

HOW MUCH:

A) All 4 days with 3 nights rooms, 7 meals is approximately \$600 plus tax & tips/Couple, Double Occupancy, includes spacious room (can sleep two couples), and 7 meals while there. (Deluxe rooms are \$300/night pp, Poolside are \$290/night pp, including meal plan with 3 dinners, 3 breakfasts and 1 lunch).

B) Usual 3 days with 2 nights rooms, 5 meals, approximately \$450 per couple.

WHAT NOW: Recognizing that fall is a peak time, they will hold the rooms until SATURDAY, AUGUST 4th for any Region member. If interested you must follow the above reservation instructions. A deposit of \$50 per person, or \$100/couple/room will be required, check payable to "NJ Region AACA" but given to Pete Cullen to deliver.

Also note that there are only 22 rooms at Lukan's, and as for the last several years, it is first come, first served. If you are late and are told all rooms are taken, I can add your name to the waiting list, as a few members have had to make last minute cancellations in the past.

Alternately, as Lukan's dining room is open to the public for meals, and if you plan to be in the area during any part of the tour, you are welcome to join in the fun for just a day trip or even for a one night stay, provided vacancy is available.

DIRECTIONS:

From North/East New Jersey Take I-80 W to Exit 26 (Hackettstown)/Rt. 46 W Follow Rt. 46 W approx 4.5 miles to the Naughright/Sandshore Road traffic light. Get in left lane to take first U-turn onto Rt. 46 East. The Paragon Village entrance is on the right.

From Morristown/Mendham/Chester Area

Take Rt. 24 W to center of Long Valley. Go right onto Schooley's Mountain Road (Continuation of Rt. 24). Follow Rt. 24 W to Rt.183 (Mountain Ave.). At second traffic light, turn right onto East Lane. Travel approximately 1 mile to traffic light and turn right onto Rt. 46 East and proceed to Paragon Village at top of hill. The entrance is on the right.

From Rt. 78 (Somerset County) Take Rt. 206 North to the center of Chester Township. Turn left onto Rt. 24 West. Follow directions from Morristown/Mendham/ Chester Area.

From Rt. 46 (Warren County) Take Rt. 46 East through Hackettstown. Proceed on Rt. 46 East to top of hill (Mt. Olive Township). The Paragon Village entrance is on the right.



"MARTHA" MERCEDES JUNE ROSER'S 1992 MERCEDES-BENZ 500SL

I have always had a desire for a red 2-seat Mercedes-Benz convertible ever since I met my husband Greg in Union High School in 1972. Home and family (and other cars) came first, but we were offered the option to purchase "Martha" a few years ago from a friend who no longer had the time to appreciate her. She is named for my late mother Martha, and my husband suggested the name. She joined her four wheeled siblings Lily, Rosie, Gloria, Pearl, Ruby, and Mr. Monte.



Martha is Signal Red, with a palomino interior and a black cloth top. The one-button roof is fully automatic, including the windshield header latching and the tonneau cover. She is unrestored and received her HPOF Award at Hershey last year. She is going for her HPOF Original Award at Hershey next month.

The 1992 500SL is a petite 176 inches long, but no lightweight at 3968 pounds. She is included in the "R129" series of Mercedes roadsters. The engine is five liters (304ci) with 322 HP and 347 ft-lb of torque. The current mileage is 40,000. This is one of the last cost-is-no-object Mercedes cars designed before the onslaught of the cheaper Japanese competition.

These cars were originally sold as playthings for the rich, and were generally well maintained. Fortunately the depreciation allowed us to afford this vehicle when the market seemed to hit bottom. It has already appreciated since we purchased her. She has gone on some local one day AACA tours, but with the minimal luggage capacity we use our Cadillacs for the overnight tours.
