

or eighth year edition, it was suggested, and your tour masters scheduled an extra day to this long weekend Region tour. First, some observations: 1) Accuweather is not accurate, 2) Fall foliage does not occur until well after the first day of Autumn, 3) Region tourists prefer 3 day weekends over 4 day weekends, 4) The food and service at Lukens cannot be beat!

Due to Hershey being scheduled a week later than usual for 2018, our usual weekend after Hershey and Columbus Day was not available, so when planning last year, we had to change to another open weekend at Lukens for this year - in September, which happened to include the first day of fall. That opened the door to some season attractions which are not available in our normal off season visit, but it turns out there was not much fall foliage to witness this year. The weather was forecast to be partly sunny and in the 70's, but turned out to be in the low 60's, gray and breezy, except, fortunately for the Scenic Lake Wallenpaupack Boat tour on Saturday morning which was cool, but dry and at the end, sunny.

The first day of this year's tour started with a nice quiet breakfast at Cracker Barrel off of Rt. 78, then through some scenic back roads in NJ and over the Riegelsville Bridge into PA. First stop was Lost River

Caverns, where I hadn't visited since a 4<sup>th</sup> grade class trip. The tour guide was entertaining, the gift shop was great, and we learned about underground rivers. Then over to lunch in Jim Thorpe, and a very interesting tour of the Asa Packer Mansion museum, with its original contents of the railroad magnate's home overlook-
