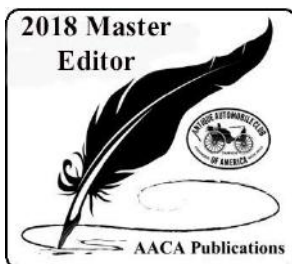

FEATURED COVER CAR—1959 CADILLAC FLEETWOOD

Owned by Joe Puleo
Watchung, NJ

So this is how a classic car addiction gets started, Joe purchased his first old car in 1977, a sharp 1937 Cadillac Fleetwood. To this very day that car is still in his collection, and the restoration has held up well. And you know how this works, the '37 looks great, but Joe always liked the styling of the '59 Cadillacs. So clearly something had to be done and he purchased his first '59 in 2001, a fully



restored red and white Seville. From then on he was hooked. Joe began purchasing a '59 almost every year, different body styles, colors. The '59 Seville was the one he would take to shows, and it won every award possible in the Cadillac & LaSalle club including Senior Crown. Joe started to think it was time to start showing another car, but nothing else in his collection was fully restored. He always thought the '59 Fleetwood was very different with the extra body side treatment and air scoops on the rear doors, so he decided to restore one that he had purchased a year earlier.

It was rust free with 53,000 original miles and it had every option. This body style for Cadillac started in 1957 and ran through 1960 but true to all cars of this era, styling changes happened every year and in 1959 the fins were in. This year of Cadillac went over the top with styling excess and it's easy to overlook the car. But in the book, *Cadillac: Standard of the World : The complete history*, by Maurice D. Hendry the author states : "As cars-rocket fins or not-they were undeniably excellent"

When you examine the 1959 Cadillac you should be reminded of high speed aircraft. In 1959 the Jet commercial airliners arrived and Cadillac designers wanted that look on the Fleetwood 60 Special. The grill is presented with two rows of brightwork that are separated by a horizontal streak of chrome. And one need to look no further than the very first Jet commercial airliner, the De Havilland Comet 4 to understand the four headlights and the huge quad turn signals built into the bumper. This quad theme continued through out the car and ended with the four turn signals built into the massive rear fins. The front grillwork was also incorporated into the rear of the car between the taillights to complete the jetliner flow thru theme. Even the dashboard resembles an aircraft cockpit.

In 1959 Cadillac offered 14 different models in 4 different series, The Fleetwood 60 was one of the top offerings. They came in 4 and 6 window configurations, the difference being the small rear vent window that went up and down. The only models that were more exclusive than the Fleetwood 60 Special Sedan was the Fleetwood 75 and Limousine.

A key feature of the 60 were the extruded aluminum panels from the rear door down the side of the rear quarter panels. A similar panel was attached to the rear decklid giving the car an appearance of massive brake cooling ductwork.

Production numbers from Cadillac indicate that 142,272 cars were built in 1959 and that 12,250 of them were Fleetwood 60 specials. The Fleetwood 60's had every option in the book including every standard feature on the 6200 and 6300 deVille's plus power vent windows and dual side mirrors. A/C was still an option but it cost \$474. A/C also got you a 3:21 rear to go with the 390 cid engine and 325 HP.



Once he committed to having another car to show, Joe started a full, over the top restoration that took three years, and it was completed in 2015. The car won its first junior at the fall Hershey meet in 2018, and Joe was surprised when he heard it was chosen for a National award. Joe trailers the car to shows, so it has only acquired 6 miles on the odometer. Joe is looking forward to bringing the Fleetwood and the Seville to the Spring National meet in June.

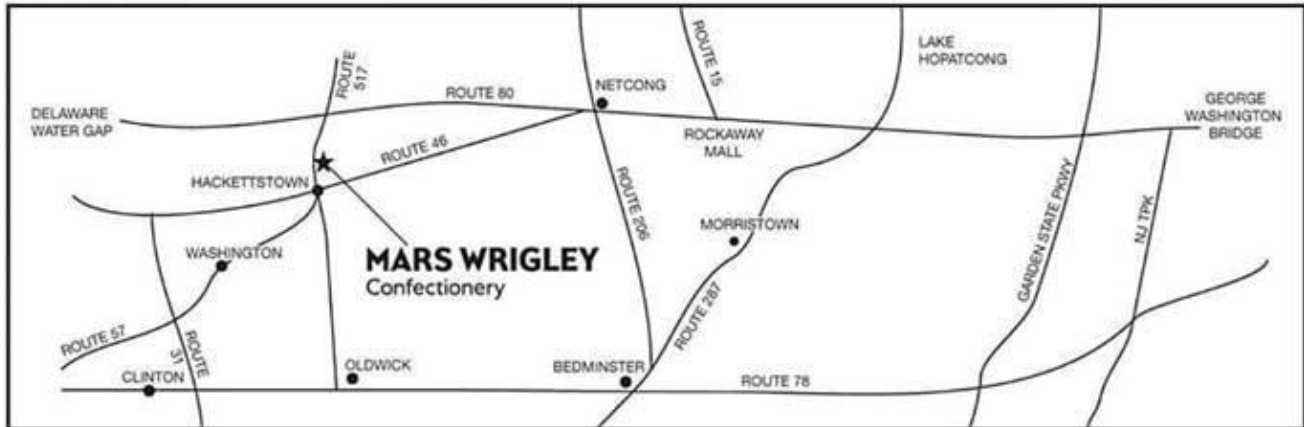

They're Only Original Once!

This is the second in a series of articles about the Historical Preservation Original Features (HPOF) class. In the last article an overview of the class was presented. The main point was the definition of an HPOF vehicle is one that retains its original components and features not restored or altered.

In this article we're going to open the doors and look at the interior. Wouldn't it be nice if every 25-year-old plus vehicle's interior looked the same as it did on the show room floor? Since most vehicles are driven as basic transportation their first 25 to 30 years of existence things happen. Kids spill things, the sun's ultraviolet rays take their toll, and basic wear and tear contribute to the deterioration of the interior's materials resulting in that used car look and smell. But with HPOF, that's OK, because it's all about originality.

If a component serves the purpose for which it was intended that's acceptable in most cases. Cracks in a leather armrest are acceptable as is some wear on all the other components. If a seat has a small tear, then repair the tear but there's no reason to recover the entire seat. It may be worn and faded but that's fine since it's still original. There are situations where an entire seat might have to be recovered but if the rest of the car is original one seat won't keep it from being HPOF certified. Broken or missing door handles, window cranks, and other knobs and handles can be replaced with NOS or salvage parts.

What about aftermarket parts? Remember, it must be an authentic vehicle as the dealer could have prepared for delivery to the customer with any feature, option, or accessory in factory literature or company directives for the model year of the vehicle. Sorry, but that AM/FM 8 track, cassette, CD, MP3, CB, XM, ESPN, ESPN2, Bluetooth unit that slices, dices, and makes Julianne fries and has a gazillion watts of power is not a factory authorized option. The fuzzy dice hanging on the rear view mirror or any other gadgets are not dealer installed options, either.

The main point is that the vehicle must have original components. NOS and salvage replacement parts are acceptable replacements if they are installed correctly. Small repairs to larger components are also acceptable. Next time we'll take a walk around the car and dive into the most controversial area of HPOF: exteriors.

Remember, they're only original once.

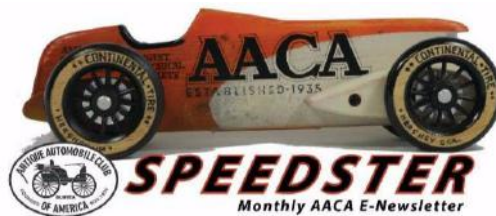

Driving the Lincoln Highway in New Jersey June 8, 2019 - Noon

You and your friends are invited to ride the New Jersey section of America's first coast-to-coast automobile highway. In 1913, the Lincoln Highway was conceived as a road that would take motorists from Longacre Square in New York City (now Times Square) to Golden Gate Park in San Francisco, CA. Our trip will be nowhere near that ambitious. As a matter of fact, our entire journey will be confined to The Lincoln Highway in the Garden State.

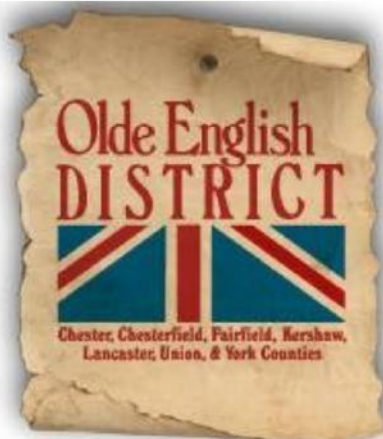

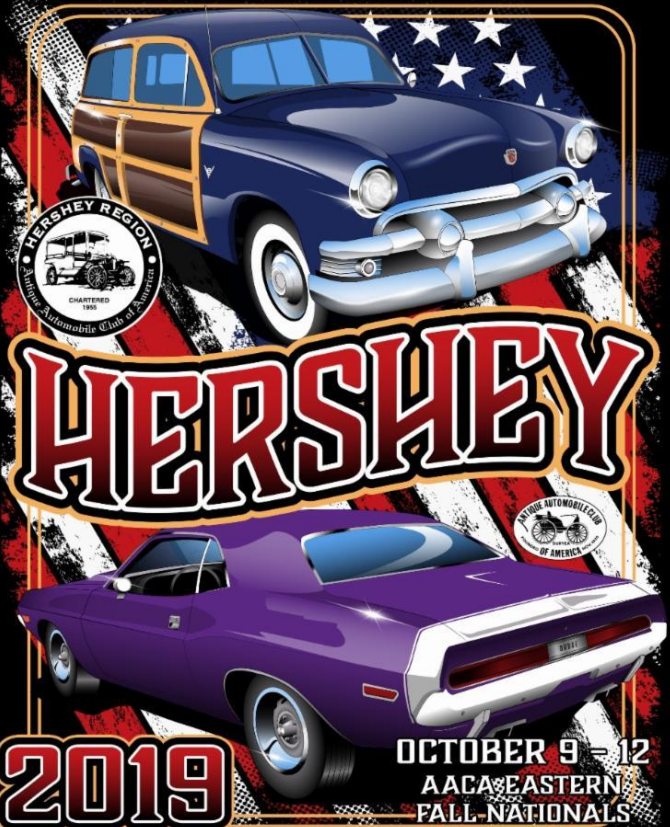
