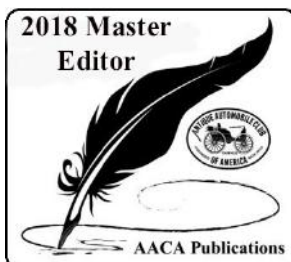

A 1953 Cadillac Series 62 Sedan, that is a lot of words for a car model, isn't it? Bernie Cooney would like all of you to be formally introduced to "Ike". When Bernie joined the NJ Region in late 1992, he was driving a 1953 Buick, more precisely, it was series 40, Riviera. That particular car was Buick's last straight 8 and the last Buick with a 6 volt electrical system. One evening Bernie was driving home from Somerville, and had stopped for a traffic light. Hearing very little noise he thought the engine had stalled, but it didn't, it was smooth as silk and it purred.

As it so happened Bernie had room in his heart and space in his garage for another car. Put that together with the small fact that there were a few pennies left over after paying bills, and you have a man on the hunt for another automotive treasure. Bernie's friend Glen, the owner of Cars Inc. in Neshanic, NJ was helping his pals flip a car and sitting in his showroom of an old Studebaker dealer was the most beautiful '50s car Bernie had ever seen. It had enough chrome to pollute the cleanest of envi-

ronments. It was love at first sight and Bernie wanted that car! On the weekend he revisited Cars Inc. to take a ride and a closer look. The car under bright sunshine cleared the fog a bit and the car seemed a tad less stunning. A test ride revealed other issues that would need resolving. Disenchanted Bernie looked for a way to bow out of the sale. "I can offer a low-ball price", he thought, "and leave friends." After the test ride Glenn asked: "What do you think?" and Bernie replied, unenthusiastically, that is was "Nice". Glen then proposes that Bernie "Make me an offer". Bernie, always the gentleman, mumbled a ridiculously low price, thinking it would be refused. Glen stared at him for a bit, smiled, and shook Bernie's hand, saying "congratulations, you just bought a Cadillac!" Perspiration no ran from every pore in his body! His mind raced and wondered: "What do you do now?" YOU DON'T WANT this car." Then Bernie was struck with an epiphany, It is a Cadillac after all and a really a

beautiful car, plus at the purchase price Bernie thought he could probably put a few dollars into it without too much trouble. Glenn shook Bernie's trembling hand and, as they say, the rest is history.

Bernie's first stop was to Don Symonds' shop for a good going over. Dave Cavagnaro has many memories (nightmares) of rewiring the car. And it took more than one trip to Roxbury Radiator, but the car left smelling like a rose. More or less.

The specifications for the Cadillac Series 62 are somewhat unique. These Cadillac were designed by the legendary Harley Earl, came in 5 different body styles and shared a platform with the Buick Roadmaster, Buick Super and the Oldsmobile 98. This particular series had 7 generations stretching from 1940 to 1964. This sample you see here was the last of the Third Generation. At new this car could purchased for about \$3,688 The thoroughly modern 331 cubic inch V-8 engine made 210 horsepower coupled with the famous GM Hydra-Matic transmission. Four speeds forward, fourth gear being 1/1 ratio. A small trivia point, GM put quite a few Dyna-flow trannies in the '53 cars and the clue would be to look at the shift pattern: The Dynaflow had Park, the

Hydromatic did not. The proper way to park a Cadillac in those days was to shift into reverse and set the parking brake. The 1953 Series 62 was the entry level car for Cadillac. You could, at extra cost, get hydraulically powered windows, Power Steering and Air Conditioning were popular options as well. The Gas fill was cleverly camouflaged behind the left tail lamp. These cars were surprisingly good on fuel for that time. Popular Mechanics at the time noted 12 MPG @ 45 mph and the gas tank held 20 gallons of fuel. Cadillac



was a luxury car for many reasons. The engineers knew how to treat both driver and passenger. The Series 62 vehicles were meant to be owner driven as opposed to the larger Fleetwood models. The dash board has map lights when you open one of the front doors that shielded the rear passenger from being unduly disturbed, the dome light lit only upon opening the passenger doors. Backseat room was large enough to accommodate many types of activities. And the Sombrero hub caps were another inspired touch of beauty.

Bernie wants you all to know that this is, in no way, a perfect show car. But "Ike" has brought him unending joy, allowing him to participate with his favorite car club.

Becoming a Judging Team Captain Mark McAlpine *Chair Continuing Judges Education*



If you're an AACA Judge, consider taking the next step and become a Certified Judging Team Captain. The process is simple, the experience is rewarding, and we need you (to ensure we have enough Team Captains for every Nationals show).

To become a Certified Team Captain, you must be a Senior Master Judge with at least 25 judging credits and need to write the AACA Vice President of Judging (currently Chuck Crane) and request to enter the Certified Team Captain Program. Once your request is received, you'll be entered in the database of Team Captains and placed on the list provided to the Chief Judge for every AACA Nationals. Whenever you register to judge at an AACA Nationals, just check the box "Do you wish to serve as a Team Captain," and the Chief Judge for the show will consider you to lead the team for one of your stated preferred classes. (Whether you're selected depends on how many members volunteer to serve as Team Captains.) The certification process is straightforward:

- ⇒ You must attend Judging School or Team Captain Judging School;
- ⇒ If you do not attend Team Captain Judging School, you must also attend a Team Captain CJE (Continuing Judges Education) lesson that year; and
- ⇒ You must serve five (5) times successfully as a Team Captain (with positive feedback from your team members and good evaluations from Judging Administration).

Upon becoming certified, you'll receive a Certified Team Captain lapel pin. Once you become a Certified Team Captain, to maintain your certification you must attend Team Captain Judging School or regular Judging School and Team Captain CJE every year. Please consider becoming a Certified Team Captain. You'll enjoy the pride of leading judging teams while learning from experienced judging team members and mentoring new ones.

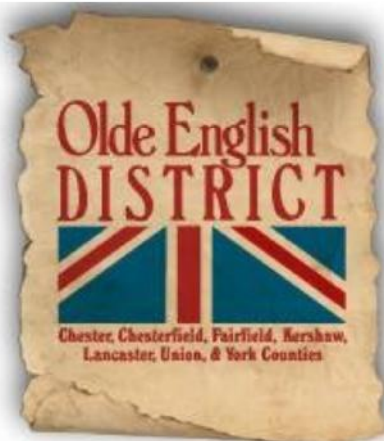

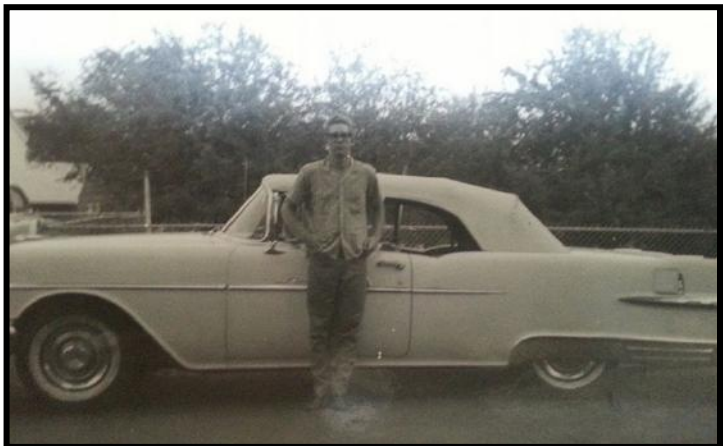

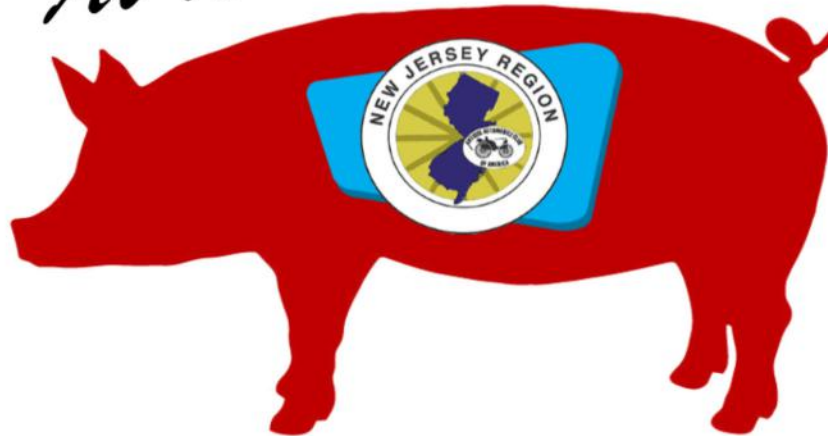
