

he 751st NJ Region AACA meeting was held in person at the Morris Plains VFW and called to order at approximately 8:00 P.M. by President Gregory Roser, who led members and guests in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Guests and New members in attendance: Guest Bob Vella was in attendance.

Meeting Minutes: A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously approved to accept the minutes from the February Region meeting, as published in the March issue of the Road Map.

### **Correspondence, Sarah Pritchett:**

- 1. A letter from AACA Library & Research Center thanking NJ Region for each \$30 donation in memory of recently passed Region members Ken Miller and Esther White.
- 2. A box containing some car club jackets that belonged to Jack and Carole Mace, who were Region members about twenty-five years ago, according to the enclosed note from their son David. David said that his mother passed away in 2000 and his father is now in a nursing home, and they found joy in their club membership. The jackets and note were given to Archivist Matt Verzi.

Treasurer's Report, Tim Schimmel: A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously approved to accept the treasurer's report.

### President's Report, Gregory Roser:

- 1. Greg updated members on the status of open positions:
  - Road Map Editor: As current editor Jay DeBoey is stepping down, Region member Dick Bettle has agreed to take over this very important position, beginning with the July issue. He has much experience as he was editor for the MG and Ford Clubs. Dick and Jay are currently working to ensure a smooth transition.
  - b. Banquet Chair: Current chair Pat Hogan will step down after our banquet on April third of this year as she is moving away to be closer to her family. Region member Betty Allen has expressed interest in taking on this position. She has served as an event planner for New York Mayor Ed Koch, and has been looking to do more with the Region.
  - Parliamentarian: Current Parliamentarian, Tex Sorrell is stepping down. This position is important C. as it ensures our meetings follow Robert's Rules of Order. Current Vice President Paul Wolfmeyer offered to take on this position, as long as it doesn't interfere with his current position as Vice President. Greg will research this issue and figure it out.

# New Jersey Region Antique Automobile Club of America Award Sponsorship Application

The New Jersey Region - AACA will hold its 69<sup>th</sup> Annual Spring Show Meet on **Sunday**, **May 1**, **2022**. Note that we have a NEW LOCATION, which includes indoor restrooms and a paved parking lot, at:

### The Lakeview Elementary School, 44 Cooper Road, Denville, NJ 07834

This year, we are again providing the opportunity for sponsorship of judging awards for each class of vehicles.

Typically, the Region draws as many as 200 restored and original condition vehicles, ranging in age from the 1900's brass era to the mid-1990's for this event. The show field is organized into 16 Judging Classes, with three Awards (1st, 2nd & 3rd) to the top vehicles in each class. The NJ Region judging procedure follows the nationally recognized AACA format. These awards are determined on the basis of vehicle authenticity, maintenance and overall quality of restoration.

Recognizing the evolution of the antique car hobby, this Spring Meet Show has expanded the eligible vehicles to also include those 25 years and older which have been modified from original design, have been customized by their owners, or are hot rods.

Your sponsorship is important to help the NJ Region continue with the Spring Meet in recognizing all award winners!

All sponsors supporting these awards will be recognized in several ways:

- Each Sponsor will have their name/business name and address announced throughout the day of the show, AND during the trophy presentations.

# Rich's Repair Ramblings April 2022 Nuts and Bolts: Part 3 Repairing Broken Fasteners

ast month we detailed various methods to remove stuck fasteners. Sooner or later you will come across one that won't budge, and worse, your best efforts will result in a snapped nut, bolt, or stud. Let's go back to an important question asked previously: how valuable is the part, and are replacements available? Repairing snapped bolts is not simple. It may be quicker and easier (albeit more expensive) to replace the component rather than try one of the methods below. At the other extreme is the possibility that the component is irreplaceable, and there is no choice but to remove the broken fastener.

If enough of the stud protrudes to allow use of locking pliers like Vise-Grips, you might try to continue methods discussed earlier using solvents or heat. I have had success this way, but patience is key. Soak the part longer than before; and apply heat longer than before. The locking pliers must get a good grip on the protrusion; if not, the pliers will slip and will chew up the outside of the stud. If it still won't budge, hacksaw the stud flush with the surface, and try these methods.

Left-hand drill bits: A left-hand drill bit spins the same direction as you would turn the bolt to remove it. In theory, if the drill bit grabs enough metal, the counter-clockwise spinning action might break the bond. Several points to remember: one, you still need to apply solvent or heat, and two, you need a reversible drill, preferably a variable-speed one. The slower the speed, the better for this method. Left-hand drill

bits are available in most hardware stores. Exercise extreme caution: you must center the pilot hole, and you must not go so deep with the bit that you risk damaging the component itself.

Screw extractors: Sometimes called 'easy-outs', these look like large aggressive drill bits. After drilling a pilot hole, the screw extractor is threaded counter-clockwise into the hole using a wrench or socket. The flutes bite into the broken stud, and in theory the extractor grabs it tightly enough to eventually loosen it. The operational theory is the same as left-handed drill bits, except the screw extractors have more aggressive splines. I've used these extensively; sometimes they work, and sometimes they destroy the stud without removing it. Like the drill bit method, you should carefully center the pilot hole, and you should be mindful of not destroying the original threads. If this doesn't work, we still have two more options to pursue below.



My screw extractor set includes the correct-sized corresponding drill bits for each

Drill and re-tap: If the first two methods are not successful or are not appropriate in your situation, your next option could be drilling out the old stud and retapping the threads using a tap and die set. This choice becomes a judgment call, and requires some skill. You must use a large enough drill bit to remove most of the stud, but not so large that there isn't enough metal remaining to cut new threads. In general, this method works better in harder metals like cast iron rather than aluminum. Again, centering the drill bit is critical to ensure that the new threads will line up with the component being fastened. After drilling out the broken stud, a tap is used to cut the new threads. This method has worked for me. (As discussed in the Feb. 2022 Ramblings, you will need a way to determine the size and pitch bolt to know the correct size tap to use.) A drill press, if one is available, helps ensure that the drilled hole is at the correct angle.

Drill and install Heli-Coil: Similar to drilling and

retapping, the offending snapped stud is also drilled out, but instead of cutting new threads with a tap, a threaded insert called a Heli-Coil is used. This approach is more appropriate in softer metals, or in cases where there isn't enough metal remaining to cut new threads. The Heli-Coil package explains the size drill bit to use. You still must use a tap to cut threads for the Heli-Coil insert! Heli-Coils are available in both SAE and metric sizes (again, you will need a way to determine the size and pitch bolt to know which size Heli-Coil to use).

All these methods require time, patience, finesse,

and a working comfort level with power tools. If the component with the broken stud is particularly valuable, you may want to consider using a professional to

complete the repair job. One technique I've employed is to purposely break a bolt in a piece of scrap metal, and use that to practice. You can't do further damage to anything that way. Always think about what your next step is going to be if the current removal method you're trying doesn't bring success! But when you do get if fixed, the feeling of accomplishment is rewarding.







