- 11. There are issues with security- it is needed twenty-four-seven. It will cost \$15,000 if they use Plainsboro Police; therefore, they are shopping around and talking to security agencies.
- 12. They will need LOTS of volunteers throughout the week-please contact Vince or Jerry to sign up!

et's Go Touring! By Mark McAlpine Vice President - National Activities

One of the pleasures of owning an antique vehicle is driving it. One of the pleasures of being a member of the AACA is to participate in group activities with fellow members. One way many members combine these two pleasures is to participate in driving tours held by their local region or chapter or by the national club. The AACA holds national driving tours that cover the breadth of years of AACA vehicle eligibility so all members can participate.

Our club offers 6-day national tours (arrival day followed by five days of touring) and 4-day divisional tours (arrival day and three days of touring). Every year the AACA holds 5-6 tours: 3-4 national tours and 2 divisional tours. - Annually: the Founders Tour (vehicles 1932 thru the current year of AACA eligibility) and the Revival AAA Glidden Tour® (1942 and older). The VMCCA hosts the Glidden Tour in even-numbered years, and the AACA hosts it in odd-numbered years. (This may swap because of the VMCCA having to cancel this year's 75th Anniversary Glidden Tour and rescheduling it to next year.) - Even-numbered years: the Reliability Tour (1915 and older), the Sentimental Tour (vehicles 1928-1958), and the Central and Eastern Divisional Tours (eligibility determined by the host region/chapter but within AACA eligible years). - Odd-numbered years: the Vintage Tour (1931 and older) plus the Southeastern and Western Divisional Tours.

Many members, especially younger members with school-age children, have said they'd like to participate in an AACA tour (many for the first time), but can't do it because they're busy and/or because it's too expensive. To help these members participate in touring, the AACA Board of Directors wants to try holding shorter, low-cost, 1-2-day tours. These tours would be on weekends and visit inexpensive places (preferably free places), especially places that would appeal to all age groups including younger families, and eliminate the formal dinners traditionally associated with national tours. Shorter, 1-2-day tours would be easier for regions/chapters to host. Many already hold inexpensive local 1-day driving tours. They could easily open these tours to AACA members outside the local region/chapter.

We would like to hold at least one of these short tours next year. If it's as popular as we hope it will be, we could expand to holding one short tour in each of our four divisions every year. If your region/chapter would be interested in hosting a short 1-2-day tour, please contact me to discuss it. Thank you very much! Be safe and stay healthy.

Rich's Repair Ramblings June 2022 My Favorite Shop Tools:

The Metric Vernier Calipers

Modern tools have spoiled us, mostly for the better. Before the invention of the electric drill, holes were bored in wood with an offset hand crank. Imagine a carpenter in 1850, drilling holes by hand in 4x4 beams all day long when building a house! Today, tools with digital readouts have become the norm. Yet there are times when a simpler way still works, some might argue for the better.

When I restored my BMW Isetta in the 1990s, I owned precision measuring tools including a micrometer and vernier calipers, but calibrated in inches. Everything on the Isetta was metric, and I needed a tool able to measure to tenths of a millimeter. At the time, I was purchasing new metric hardware from a company near my office, and they also sold metric vernier calipers, for which I recall paying under \$20, including a protective case. The calipers were plastic, but seemed to be well-made.

(Fun fact: "vernier" is defined in the dictionary a movable, auxiliary graduated scale attached to a main graduated scale, calibrated to indicate subdivisions of the larger scale. The word comes from the surname of its inventor, Pierre Vernier, who died in 1637. Little could he have imagined his invention still used 385 years later.)


Both a micrometer and vernier calipers can precisely measure the outside diameter of an object; the additional advantages of vernier calipers is their ability to also measure inside diameter as well as depth of an opening. My new tool was a joy to use, and came in handy for all kinds of measurements when rebuilding the engine, transmission, and chassis. More recently, I used the calipers to measure the pistons in my Alfa Romeo's brake calipers ("calipers" defined as something with two moveable arms).

In the photo below, the inside diameter jaws are circled in red, the outside diameter jaws in blue, the locking tab which prevents the sliding portion of the tool from moving to preserve a measurement in green, and a thumb wheel for ease in making precise movements of

the scale in yellow.




To read the scale, first, locate the "zero" on the sliding portion of the scale; if it lines up exactly with a line on the fixed portion of the scale, you have your measurement in a whole millimeter (as seen in the photo of the brake piston: the "0" on the top, or sliding, scale, lines up exactly with the "30" on the bottom, or fixed, scale). However, if the zero mark is between two lines, your first number is the lower of the two (if the mark is between "3" and "4", your first number is "3"). Next, find the line on the sliding scale which lines up most precisely with a line on the main scale. Remember that this number represents TENTHS of a millimeter. To obtain your final result, add the two numbers together.

In the photo below, I am measuring the brake pad material thickness on a brand-new pad. Using the inside jaws, I see that the zero mark on the sliding scale is between the 9 and the 10 on the fixed scale, so our initial number is "9". Next, I look for the mark on the sliding scale which most closely lines up with a mark on the fixed scale. The closest number on the sliding scale which does that is the 5. This represents "0.5mm". Adding our two numbers together, 9 + .5 equals 9.5. The brake pad material is 9.5mm thick.

Not shown in the photos is the metal tang which protrudes from the end of the vernier calipers as the sliding scale is moved. The tang is used to measure depth, for example, into a blind hole. This is very convenient, for example, when determining what length bolt might best fit into a threaded opening.

My vernier calipers are very handy to use: they are light, easy to adjust, and quickly provide a readout. Even when I might otherwise grab a ruler for measurements which do not need to be so precise, I find myself reaching for these vernier calipers. As an example, if I'm sorting through metric hardware and need to sort bolts by length, it's easier to measure the bolts with vernier calipers than it is with a ruler.

Sometimes I rank my tools based on a price range, such as "that's the best X dollars I've ever spent on a tool!" I would say that my plastic vernier calipers, which have held up beautifully for 30 years, would rank as "the best \$20 I've ever spent on a tool!". If you don't own one and you need to do precise measuring of any kind, I and Pierre Vernier both highly recommend it.
