

1993 GMC Typhoon

Here is my other car, which for many people is a sleeper. It is a 1993 GMC Typhoon. The engine was recently rebuilt by ARC Motorsports in Rockaway and I am awaiting the rebuilt turbo charger, which will enable me to hit the road full time.



Last year, in a moment of weakness enabled by COVID, I purchased a 1993 GMC Typhoon.

The GMC Typhoon SUV was produced by GMC from 1992 until 1993 The Typhoon was based on the 1991 GMC Syclone (GMC's spelling) pickup truck.

The Typhoon is powered by a turbo charged 4.3 LV6 engine, with unique pistons, main caps, head gaskets,

intake manifolds, fuel system, exhaust manifolds, and a 48mm twin bore throttle body from the 5.7 L GM Small-Block engine. With this engine, the Typhoon produces 280 h.p. and 350 lbft of torque. The engine is a modified version of the Vortec engine found in the standard Jimmy, which originally produced 190 h.p. The engine uses a Mitsubishi TD06-17C/8 turbocharger, producing 14 psi of boost and a Garrett Water/Air intercooler.



The Typhoon sends power to all four wheels through a 4L60 4-speed automatic transmission found in the same year Corvette and a Borg Warner 4472 transfer case, which splits torque with 35% forward and 65% to the rear wheels. Other features include upgraded brakes,



a limited-slip rear differential and sport modifications to the standard suspension. The Typhoon also features an air-operated self-leveling rear suspension.

As can be seen in the photographs, the Typhoon is considered a truck. The interior is a mix of truck and luxury automobile. The seats are akin to a Barcalounger in your den, but the dashboard is very truck-like.

Advertising of the day by GMC compared its acceleration to the fastest factory vehicles of the day.

Of the 2085 produced in 1993, only 115 Typhoons possess the subject car's color and interior combination. Only 2501 Typhons were manufactured in 1992.



The SUV truly embodies the title of a sport utility vehicle. Other stock features include upgraded brakes, a limited-slip rear differential, sport modifications to the standard Jimmy suspension and leather upholstery. In 1993, only 115 Typhoons were produced in Frost White with gray cladding.

In its day, during tests by Car and Driver, the Typhoon was capable of accelerating from 0–60 mph in 5.3 seconds and could do a quarter-mile run in 14.1 seconds at 95 mph.

From the factory, the Typhoon features an air-



operated self-leveling rear suspension, 4 wheel anti-lock brakes, air conditioning, power steering, power brakes, cruise control, adjustable steering wheel, fog lights, a Delco AM/FM/Cassette Tape stereo with equalizer, and power mirrors, windows and door locks.

The Proper Way to Wash Your Car

In writing an article about washing our cars, a weekend task which is as old as the automobile itself, the cliche "everything old is new again" comes to mind. Imagine that it's a hundred years ago, 1923, and you've just returned home from a 10-mile round trip into town and back in your 1923 Oldsmobile. The roads to and from town are not yet paved, and are a mix of gravel and mud. As you disembark, you see that your new Olds is filthy, so you pump some water from the well pump into a metal bucket, grab some lye soap and a heavy bristle brush, and go to work. Today, we follow the same basic process, but some of the details have changed! Actually, with the introduction of concepts like "waterless washing" and "foam blasting" there have been major changes to the details. But for the most part, our AACA jalopies don't get as dirty as our daily drivers, as they are not subject to the same year-round rigors of the road. Therefore, this article will focus on the traditional "hose and bucket" method.

Based on the reasonable presumption that you are about to wash a 25-to-75-year-old touring or show car which isn't that dirty, meaning that it has a collection of dust on it or it got caught in a brief shower, let's review some best practices when washing a car using a garden hose and bucket. Start with being aware of your environmental conditions: it's best to wash a car in the shade, not in the sun, and when the surface is cool to the touch. You don't want to wet a car in the heat and run the risk that the soap and water will dry on the surface. Next, using gentle hose pressure, rinse the car starting at the top and work your way down. Be sure to rinse the wheels and tires as well as the wheel wells, using slightly greater water pressure if necessary.

Gather your car wash tools and supplies. You should have two buckets, one for soapy water and one with clear water; a liquid soap specifically made for car washing (NOT kitchen detergent); a soft cotton cloth or microfiber cloth for washing; and a chamois or large microfiber towel for drying. Put some car wash soap into the first bucket and fill the bucket with water, letting the

soap create lots of foam. The second bucket should have only water in it. Again, starting at the top of the car, wash one area at a time. Each time you finish an area or a panel of the car, put the washcloth into the second bucket to rinse it off before returning it to the soapy bucket. Using the hose, rinse the soap off each area of the car as you proceed.

Don't forget the door jambs. Be careful with the hose, as you don't want to soak the car's interior. I sometimes use yet another microfiber cloth for areas like these where I cannot use a hose. Regarding the engine compartment, depending on the level of dirt and the extent to which you plan to clean, you might want to tackle the underhood cleaning as a separate project. On some of my cars, if the engine compartment is not that dirty, I will wash the painted areas at the same time I'm washing the rest of the car. The last thing you want, though, is to get oil or grease on your washcloth, as once that happens, you cannot use it on the exterior painted surfaces.

Similar to the engine compartment, I may or may not give the wheels and tires a thorough washing at this time. If they are not that dirty, I will wash them as a final step, using a soft bristle brush. If they require more than a light cleaning, I will use a spray cleaner dedicated for wheels and wash them separately.



While I'm proceeding, if my "rinse" bucket water starts to look dirty, I will consider dumping it and refilling it with clean water. The whole point of the two-bucket wash method is to avoid dragging dirt over the surface of the car. Once all the exterior surfaces have been washed, use a towel or cloth dedicated to drying, and wipe down the entire car top to bottom. At this point, whether I have washed the door and trunk jambs or not, I make sure to open each door and wipe all the surfaces dry. Each of my cars has its own unique "trouble spots" where water tends to collect, so I have gotten used to paying attention to those areas to make sure they are dry. As a final step, no matter how clean the glass looks, I use a dedicated

glass cleaner on all exterior glass, because my drying efforts still may leave some spotting on the glass.

Back to the wheels and tires: both of my collector



cars have disc brakes, and it has been my experience that in spite of all the mechanical advantages of these systems, one clear disadvantage is a greater amount of brake dust which ends up on the wheels. Sometimes it is sufficient to use car wash soap to clean them. But sometimes I need to use a product dedicated to wheel cleaning. Your car's wheels may be steel, aluminum, or some alloy. Read the labels carefully and purchase the product that is an appropriate match. If the wheels and tires are particularly dirty, I will remove each of them from the car, and give them a very thorough scrubbing front and back! This is also an ideal time to use a "tire black" treatment, as doing so when the tires are off the car



means you can avoid spraying that stuff on the paint.
