

Engine Oil API Ratings

The last several Ramblings columns discussed engine oil viscosity, which refers to an oil's ability to flow as affected by temperature. Another rating with which we should become familiar is the API service category rating. API stands for American Petroleum Institute, an industry trade group. Motor oils intended for use in light-duty vehicles are assigned a two-letter code, the first letter of which is "S" ("Spark") for gasoline engines, or "C" ("Compression") for diesel engines. On the presumption that most of our jalopies are equipped with gasoline engines, we will limit our discussion to oils for those engines.

The API standards began during the decade of the 1920s with, conveniently enough, the "SA" rating. This was followed by "SB" through "SH", bringing us up to the year 1996. It is important to note that according to the API, not only are service grades "SA" through "SH" obsolete, but their use in any modern engine could cause damage. This is because these older oils do not have the level of additives required to protect today's engines, based on the requirements of the motor vehicle manufacturers themselves.

In 1997, the "SJ" grade was introduced, followed by "SL", "SM", "SN", and in what is a first for an oil service

grade, "SN Plus", where a word is added to the grade designation. In May 2020, the newest grade as of this writing, "SP", was introduced. The "SJ" and newer grades are considered "current" or "active" grades, and so may be appropriate for model year vehicles which correspond to these grades (see chart). These ratings are not assigned randomly. In fact, motor oil manufacturers must apply to the API and verify that their oils meet the standards. Only then can the service rating be applied to the label on their products. The API coordinates the standards with the motor vehicle industry for those model years.

Here is where things become controversial for our older cars. There

is a general presumption that newer service-rated oils are "backwards compatible", implying that it is perfectly acceptable to dump 5 quarts of "SP" rated oil into the crankcase of your '55 Packard. However, a major concern for those of us in the collector car hobby is that our older engines require phosphorus which is a major anti-wear component; you may be more familiar with it as ZDDP, sometimes simply referred to as zinc. Phosphorus is harmful to catalytic converters, standard on almost every new car since 1975, so modern motor oils have phased it out. Does this mean that you should seek out, for example, an "SG" rated oil for your 1990 Chrysler? If you do, you will be losing the value of some of the latest additive technology.

The motor oil industry recognizes that there may be certain circumstances, for example, performance engines, which require engine protection above what a modern "SP" rated oil can deliver. This has given birth to special oils with higher levels of phosphorus or zinc, needed in flat-tappet engines. Two oils with which I am familiar are Valvoline VR1 (which I've used for 10 years in my Alfa with no ill consequences) and Castrol GTX Classic. Both openly advertise their higher levels of zinc and explicitly state that they are for use in overhead valve or flat tappet engines. Both are available on Amazon or at other retailers. These oils should NOT be used in catalytic converter-equipped cars. As a final comment, I have read that if your older engine needs the protection of extra zinc, it is better to supply it via an oil which contains the zinc, rather than pouring in a zinc additive. as the additive may not circulate or combine with the motor oil as thoroughly as engine oil manufactured with it. I have no experience good or bad with the additive approach, and can only reiterate that the Valvoline VR1 has served its purpose for me very well during 13,000 miles of driving in my 1967 Alfa.

1951 CHEVROLET BEL AIR

I found my 1951 Chevy when I was a student at Park's College in St. Louis in 1968. In 1951 the Bel Air was the top-of-the-line for Chevrolet. I first saw the car in the St. Louis Dispatch - that's how we found cars then -in the newspaper. The woman I purchased it from was the original owner. She needed to sell it because her peers thought it was "old" and she wanted to buy a new car. The



car was 17 years old by then and had about 56,000 miles on it. I already had a car in St. Louis so when it was time to go home, my wife drove the car we arrived in, and I drove the Bel Air to New Jersey without any problems. I used the car until the automatic transmission failed and parked it in my garage where it stayed for over thirty years. When I finally retired in 2004, I thought, now is the time to



restore this diamond-in-the-rough.

In order facilitate the restoration, I bought a rotisserie so I wouldn't have to lay under the car. I didn't have a car lift at that time and this was the best solution. I began by removing the bumpers, grill, fenders, hood and laboriously prepared them for their primer paint. As I removed these parts it was apparent that the previous owner was not a good driver, for I found many poorly





done repairs. Consequently, I had to straighten the fenders, doors, and quarter panels by hand. After all these pieces were removed, I lifted the body off the frame and attached it to the rotisserie. At that point, I removed the front and rear suspension and had the frame sandblasted and powder coated by Xtreme Powder Coating in Easton, PA.

Throughout the process, the fenders and other parts were stored in the guest room of my room for safe keeping. Ninety-five percent of the hardware was reused after they were cadmium plated including the trunk latches and hood hinges. The bumpers, door handles, grill, emblems were chrome plated, and the stainless steel polished by Metal Masters in Baptistown, NJ. All the other bolts and nuts I sandblasted myself.



I found the engine in relatively good condition and during the disassembly, I saw that the rings were worn,





but the cylinder walls just needed honing. I was able to reuse the pistons. The cylinder head only needed to be planed four-thousandths.



As you may know, the windshield on the two-door hardtop and convertible is 1-1/2" lower than the sedans or coupes. Mine needed to be replaced so I gave one-half of



the windshield as a pattern to the glass company (not to be named). However, when I received the new windshield it was too large. Long story short, I was not at the point to insert the windshield, and by the time I got around to installing it, the company would not give me credit for their mistake. Consequently, I had to reorder a new one at my expense. Needless to say I was not a happy a man.

The interior is another story. I ordered it a year ahead of time from LaBaron-Bonny and gave them a \$3,000 deposit. And as you may know, they went bankrupt and I lost my money. One has to expect surprises when doing a restoration. I finally had the interior completed by Vinnie's Interiors of New Briton, PA who used my old interior as a pattern. He did an excellent job and does finely detailed work.

I had Doug North from Cars Autobody of Clinton, NJ paint the car in his spray booth under ideal conditions. It came out perfect. Another job well done.





The Hood Ornament was in pretty bad shape so I had it gold plated. In 1951 this was an accessory and, at that time gold was only \$31/once. Not sure I would have it gold plated today.

All-in-all it took four and one-half years to complete from start to finish. It was a labor of love and I am pleased to say that I won a Grand National.




